The project consists of replacing 1,852 linear feet of sewer main, extending existing sewer mains an additional 1,876 linear feet, and installing 1,960 linear feet of water mains. The project will benefit 155 persons, of whom 150 (97%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$573,979, with \$73,979 in match and leverage funds.
1675	Ashburn, City of Water Improvements	\$237,639	The City of Ashburn proposes to use \$237,639 in CDBG funds for water system improvements. The project will replace 5,260 linear feet of undersized water lines with 6-inch PVC mains and install seven new hydrants. The project will benefit 116 persons, of whom 107 (92%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$270,835, with \$33,196 in match and leverage.
1676	Bainbridge, City of Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$277,280	The City of Bainbridge proposes to use \$277,280 in CDBG funds for storm drainage improvements in the Wheat Avenue neighborhood. The project will replace undersized drainage pipes, improve catch basins and drop inlets, and add drainage infrastructure on Broughton Street. The project will benefit 65 persons, of whom 62 (95%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$388,529, with \$111,249 in match and leverage.
1713	Bulloch County Senior Center	\$750,000	Bulloch County proposes to use \$750,000 to assist with the construction of a new 6,200 square-foot senior activity center on County owned property in the City of Statesboro. The new center will replace the existing center located on Denmark Street. The project will benefit 124 persons, of whom 124 (100%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$951,346, with \$201,346 in match and leverage.
1722	Burke County Health Center	\$734,845	Burke County proposes to use \$734,854 in CDBG funds for the renovation of the Burke County Health Department. The project will benefit 401 persons, of whom 366 (91%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$776,365, with \$41,520 in match and leverage.

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1684	Butler, City of Sewer Improvements	\$705,419	The City of Butler proposes to use \$705,419 in CDBG funds for sewer improvements on Judge Street, Ridge Street, MLK Jr. Boulevard, Mason Lane, Georgia Road, Whitening Road, and Mockingbird. The project will benefit 145 persons, of whom 123 (84%) are LMI. The project will replace failing and undersized sewer lines with 8-inch PVC mains and replace failing manholes with 24 new manholes. The total project cost is \$774,705, with \$69,286 in match and leverage.
1749	Charlton County Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$623,889	Charlton County proposes to use \$623,889 of CDBG funds to provide street paving and drainage improvements to Forest Lake Drive and Forest Lake Court. The project will benefit 54 persons, of whom 41 (75%) are LMI. Total project cost is \$693,679, with 69,790 in match and leverage funds.
1716	Chickamauga, City of Water Improvements	\$544,478	The City of Chickamauga proposes to use \$544,478 in CDBG funds for water system improvements in the Longwood/Park Street neighborhood. The project will consist of the installation of 5,650 linear feet of 6-inch PVC, 1,160 linear feet of 2-inch PVC, and two fire hydrants. The project will benefit 147 persons, of whom 124 (84%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$653,147, with \$108,669 in match and leverage.
1775	Coffee County Neighborhood Revitalization	\$498,925	Coffee County proposes to use \$498,925 in CDBG funds to implement Phase 2 of rehabilitation in the Oak Park neighborhood. The project consists of the rehabilitation of two owner-occupied deteriorated housing units, reconstruction of five owner-occupied dilapidated housing units, and the acquisition and clearance of six vacant, dilapidated units. The project will directly benefit 14 persons, of whom 100% are LMI. The total project cost is \$508,394, with \$9,469 in match and leverage funds.
1743	Collins, City of Sewer Improvements	\$750,000	The City of Collins proposes to use \$750,000 in CDBG funds for sewer improvements. The project will consist of manhole rehabilitation; cleaning 8,825 linear feet of existing gravity sewer; 8,825 linear feet of Cured-in-Place rehabilitation for the existing 8-inch sewer; 6,225 linear feet of 4-inch PVC service laterals; and 83 sewer service connections. The project will benefit 178 persons, of whom 166 (93%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$838,841, with \$88,841 in match and leverage.

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1689	Cordele, City of Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$500,000	The City of Cordele proposes to use \$500,000 in CDBG funds for drainage improvements in the Gillespie Selden Neighborhood. The project will benefit 187 persons, of whom 187 (100%) are LMI. The project consists of replacing the roadway ditches and deteriorated storm pipe system with properly sized storm sewer pipe and inlets. The total project cost is \$549,800, with \$49,800 in match and leverage.
1735	Cornelia, City of Water/Sewer Improvements	\$750,000	The City of Cornelia proposes to use \$750,000 in CDBG funds for sewer and drainage improvements in the Old Cleveland Road and Wayside/Foster Street neighborhood. The project consists of installing 3,900 linear feet of 8-inch sanitary sewer, 2,700 linear feet of 10-inch sanitary sewer, 22 manholes, and 1,300 linear feet of 6-inch PVC service laterals. The project will benefit 475 persons, of whom 432 (91%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$3,032,987, with \$2,282,987 in match and leverage funds.
1671	Crisp County Water Improvements	\$243,891	Crisp County proposes to use \$243,891 in CDBG funds for water system improvements in the Willow Lake mobile home park. The project will consist of replacing 2,050 linear feet of water line and the installation of two fire hydrants. The project will benefit 51 persons, of whom 37 (72%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$294,843, with \$50,952 in match and leverage.
1750	Dexter, City of Sewer Improvements	\$420,700	The City of Dexter proposes to use \$420,700 in CDBG funds for rehabilitation of its wastewater treatment plant. The project will benefit 611 persons, of whom 491 (80%) are LMI. Total project cost is \$471,300, with \$50,600 in match and leverage funds.
1754	Dooling, City of Neighborhood Revitalization	\$630,094	The City of Dooling proposes to use \$630,094 in CDBG funds for neighborhood revitalization. The project will consist of the acquisition and clearance of four vacant/dilapidated housing units, rehabilitation of six housing units, and reconstruction of six housing units. The clearance project will benefit 96 persons, of whom 82 (85%) are LMI. The rehabilitation and reconstruction projects will benefit 100% LMI. Total project cost is \$641,770, with \$11,676 in match and leverage funds.

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1683	Dublin, City of Neighborhood Revitalization	\$710,000	The City of Dublin proposes to use \$710,000 in CDBG funds for neighborhood revitalization on Flanders, Pritchett, Chester, Marcus, and Roberts Streets. The project will rehabilitate 13 housing units, reconstruct one housing unit, and acquire and clear three units. The project will benefit 139 persons, of whom 125 (90%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$763,577, with \$53,577 in match and leverage.
1718	Fort Valley, City of Sewer Improvements	\$750,000	The City of Fort Valley proposes to use \$750,000 in CDBG funds for sewer improvements for a Target Area that encompasses Carmen and Courtland Avenues, Boulevard, College, Neil, and South Montrose Streets, and Mimosa Drive. The project will install 4,400 linear feet of 8-inch main, 1,300 linear feet of 6-inch PVC force main, manholes, and related items. The project will benefit 452 persons, of whom 416 (92%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$850,000, with \$100,000 in match and leverage.
1677	Franklin, City of Water/Sewer Improvements	\$750,000	The City of Franklin proposes to use \$750,000 in CDBG funds for water and sewer improvements in the South River Road Target Area and Target Area 2, which includes 20 units of the Franklin Housing Authority and an apartment complex on Main Street. The project will include rehabilitation of 10,320 linear feet of sewer lines, installation of 1,100 linear feet of 6-inch water main and two fire hydrants. The project will benefit 330 persons, of whom 322 (98%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$985,000, with \$235,000 in match and leverage.
1742	Glennville, City of Sewer Improvements	\$750,000	The City of Glennville proposes to use \$750,000 in CDBG funds for sewer improvements. The project will consist of the rehabilitation of 11,035 linear feet of 8-inch gravity sewer mains. The project will benefit 327 persons, of whom 302 (92%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$916,281, with \$166,281 in match and leverage.
1690	Griffin, City of Water/Sewer Improvements	\$750,000	The City of Griffin proposes to use \$750,000 in CDBG funds for water and sewer improvements for Phase II of the Meriwether Target Area. The project will replace galvanized and cast iron water mains with ductile iron pipe water mains, add fire hydrants, replace failing clay sewer mains (pipebursting method), replace sewer laterals, and related items. The project will benefit 95 persons, of whom 90 (95%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$1,250,185, with \$500,185 in match and leverage.

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1694	Habersham County Senior Center	\$750,000	Habersham County proposes to use \$750,000 in CDBG funds for public facility expansion of the Habersham Senior Center. The project will construct a new wellness center building to house a comprehensive wellness program, while also creating space in the main senior center building for the facility's other service offerings. The project will benefit 1,400 persons, of whom 1,400 (100%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$838,982, with \$88,982 in match and leverage.
1721	Hancock County Health Center	\$627,950	Hancock County proposes to use \$627,950 in CDBG funds for public facility improvements to renovate the existing Hancock County Health Department building located at 516 Boland Street. The project will include exterior improvements (Hardi-plank siding, water sealant, roof replacement, window and door replacement, etc.) and interior improvements (new HVAC, layout changes, handicap accessible restrooms, exam rooms, etc.). The project will benefit 185 persons, of whom 174 (94.05%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$727,950, with \$100,000 in match and leverage.
1699	Hogansville, City of Water/Sewer Improvements	\$637,900	The City of Hogansville proposes to use \$637,900 in CDBG funds for water and sewer improvements in Target Area A (Blue Creek Ct., Blue Creek Rd., Lincoln St., Royal Ave., and Askew Ave.) and Target Area B (Askew Ave. and Lawrence St.). The project will install 8-inch PVC sewer main, rehabilitate and replace manholes, install cross-linked polyethylene tubing water main and valves, plus related items. The project will benefit 139 persons, of whom 124 (89.21%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$704,751, with \$66,851 in match and leverage.
1688	Jasper County Senior Center	\$750,000	Jasper County proposes to use \$750,000 in CDBG funds for public facility improvements to the existing Senior Citizen Center located at 26 Mack Tillman Drive. The project will expand the Senior Citizen Center by 2,688 square feet (exercise room, ADA compliant restrooms, food storage, porch and more) and renovate existing space (ADA improvements to drop-off area, cabinetry, flooring, lighting, etc.). The project will benefit 144 persons, of whom 144 (100%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$949,278, with \$199,278 in match and leverage.
1685	Lamar County Health Center	\$750,000	Lamar County proposes to use \$750,000 in CDBG funds for public facility construction of a new Public Health Department building, to be located at 118 Academy Drive. The new 6,076 square-foot building will replace the current inadequate facility. The project will benefit 2,440 persons, of whom 2,130 (87.3%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$1,082,746, with \$332,746 in match and leverage.

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1779	Lumpkin County Senior Center	\$595,726	Lumpkin County proposes to use \$595,726 in CDBG funds for the expansion of a senior center facility to serve seniors throughout Lumpkin County. The total number of beneficiaries is 1,042, with 100% LMI benefit. Total project cost is \$655,326, with \$59,600 in match and leverage funds.
1781	Milledgeville, City of Sewer Improvements	\$678,277	The City of Milledgeville proposes to use \$678,277 in CDBG funds to replace aging sewer lines in two Target Areas southeast of downtown. This is Phase II of a multi-stage project. The proposal will benefit 118 persons, of whom 89 (75%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$780,447, with \$102,170 in match and leverage funds.
1705	Montezuma, City of Water Improvements	\$750,000	The City of Montezuma proposes to use \$750,000 in CDBG funds for city-wide water improvements. The project will replace aerators in two water plants, remove and install pressure valves to correct pressure inadequacies, replace water mains, service connections, and fire hydrants, and related items. The project will benefit 3,284 persons, of whom 2,430 (74%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$828,079, with \$78,079 in match and leverage.
1744	Newington, City of Sewer Improvements	\$600,000	The City of Newington proposes to use \$600,000 in CDBG funds for sewer improvements. The project will consist of installing 33 2-Stage Bio-Shell Units and Blowers, a new chlorination building, chlorination equipment, and a floating cover for algae control. The project will benefit 239 persons, of whom 183 (77%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$696,000, with \$96,000 in match and leverage.
1768	Ocilla, City of Multi Infrastructure Improvements	\$750,000	The City of Ocilla proposes to use \$750,000 in CDBG funds for sanitary sewer, water, street, and drainage improvements. These improvements will take place along 5th, 6th, 7th, Oak, Pine, Lincoln, McKinley, and Roosevelt Streets. The project will benefit 126 persons, of whom 114 (90%) are LMI. Total project cost is \$1,349,602, with \$599,602 in match and leverage funds.

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1767	Omega, City of Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$370,713	The City of Omega proposes to use \$370,713 in CDBG funds to provide street paving and drainage improvements. The project consists of paving a portion of County Line Road and the creation of roadside ditches for drainage. The project will benefit 68 persons, of whom 61 (90%) are LMI. Total project cost is \$417,568, with 46,855 in match and leverage funds.
1772	Pearson, City of Multi Infrastructure Improvements	\$750,000	The City of Pearson proposes to use \$750,000 of CDBG funds to provide water, street, and drainage improvements along Kira Loop, Phillip Lane, and Beth Lane. The project will consist of the installation of new 6-inch water mains, fire hydrants, paving all three streets, and the installation of drainage ditching. The project will benefit 144 residents, of whom 134 (93%), are LMI. Total project cost is \$839,713, with \$89,713 in match and leverage funds.
1755	Pelham, City of Neighborhood Revitalization	\$725,773	The City of Pelham proposes to use \$725,773 in CDBG funds for neighborhood revitalization. The project consists of the acquisition and clearance of eight vacant/dilapidated housing units, the rehabilitation of nine housing units, and the reconstruction of five housing units. The clearance project will benefit 55 persons, of whom 46 (84%) are LMI. Reconstruction and rehabilitation will benefit 100% LMI persons. Total project cost is \$751,233. with \$25,460 in match and leverage funds.
1681	Perry, City of Neighborhood Revitalization	\$722,000	The City of Perry proposes to use \$722,000 in CDBG funds for neighborhood revitalization on Bill, Betty, Jeanne, and Edwards Streets. The project will rehabilitate eight housing units, reconstruct three housing units, and acquire and clear five housing units. The project will benefit 77 persons, of whom 71 (92.21%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$771,371, with \$49,371 in match and leverage.
1752	Pierce County Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$750,000	Pierce County proposes to use \$750,000 in CDBG funds for street and drainage improvements . The project consists of paving 1.47 miles of dirt roads and installation of adequate drainage improvements. The project will benefit 145 persons, of whom 117 (80%) are LMI. Total project cost is \$897,864, with \$147,864 in match and leverage funds.

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1698	Pine Mountain, City of Drainage Improvements	\$578,550	The City of Pine Mountain proposes to use \$578,550 in CDBG funds for drainage improvements in the King, Cherry, Blanchard, and Church neighborhood. The project will install a 25-year storm drainage system (removal of dilapidated structures, grading, installation of concrete valley gutters, revised piping locations). The project will benefit 219 persons, of whom 197 (89.95%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$789,550, with \$211,000 in match and leverage.
1704	Reynolds, City of Water/Sewer Improvements	\$490,000	The City of Reynolds proposes to use \$490,000 in CDBG funds for water and sewer improvements in a Target Area encompassing E. Calhoun, Liberty, Lashley, and Mimms Streets. The project will replace existing asbestos cement water mains with PVC water mains and vitrified clay gravity sewer mains with new 8-inch PVC gravity sewer, including manholes. The project will benefit 86 persons, of whom 70 (81.4%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$534,780, with \$44,780 in match and leverage.
1758	Rincon, City of Water/Sewer Improvements	\$750,000	The City of Rincon proposes to use \$750,000 in CDBG funds for water and sewer system improvements. The project includes installing 1,108 linear feet of 6-inch water mains, installation of two new fire hydrants, construction of one new wastewater pump station, installation of 2,596 linear feet of 8-inch gravity sewer, and the installation of 2,460 linear feet of 4-inch force main. The project will benefit 127 persons, of whom 110 (87%) are LMI. Total project cost \$1,491,700, with \$741,700 in match and leverage funds.
1728	Sandersville, City of Boys and Girls Club	\$750,000	The City of Sandersville proposes to use \$750,000 in CDBG funds for building rehabilitation to the Boys and Girls Club facility (the former National Guard Armory building) located at 320 Riddleville Road. The project will make exterior and interior improvements (roof, fencing, HVAC, fire alarm system, insulation, windows, kitchen, etc.). The project will benefit 145 children, of whom 110 (76%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$780,000, with \$30,000 in match and leverage.
1760	Sparks, City of Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$676,552	The City of Sparks proposes to use \$676,552.00 in CDBG funds to provide street paving and drainage improvements on Briarcliff Circle and Deerfield Drive. This project consists of paving two roads and the installation of adequate drainage. The project will benefit 182 persons, of whom 164 (90%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$745,929, with \$69,377 in match and leverage funds.

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1748	Surrency, City of Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$599,821	The City of Surrency proposes to use \$599,821 in CDBG funds to provide road and drainage improvements on Thomas, Wildes, Crosby, and Eason Streets. The project will consist of paving the four streets, installation of roll-over curb and gutter, and the installation of reinforced concrete pipe to facilitate proper drainage. The project will benefit 42 persons, of whom 38 (90%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$712,571, with \$112,750 in match and leverage funds.
1702	Talbotton, City of Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	The City of Talbotton proposes to use \$500,000 in CDBG funds for sewer improvements for a citywide Target Area. The project will rehabilitate six existing pump stations. The project will benefit 551 persons, of whom 455 (82.6%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$520,000, with \$20,000 in match and leverage.
1741	Thomasville, City of Multi Infrastructure Improvements	\$750,000	The City of Thomasville proposes to use \$750,000 of CDBG funds for water, sewer, and storm water drainage improvements in the Fletcherville Neighborhood. The project will benefit 448 persons, of whom 434 (97%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$1,956,000, with \$1,206,000 in match and leverage funds.
1733	Thomson, City of Multi Activity Program	\$1,000,000	The City of Thomson proposes to use \$1,000,000 in CDBG funds for multi-activity improvements (rehabilitation of seven owner occupied housing units as well as water, sewer, and flood and drainage infrastructure). This is Phase I of the Sills Branch Revitalization Area Strategy (RAS). The benefit numbers are as follows: 259 persons (of whom 257 or 99.2% are LMI) for flood and drainage improvements; 110 persons (of whom 108 or 98.2% are LMI) for sewer improvements; 110 persons (of whom 110 or 100% are LMI) for water improvements; 17 persons (of whom 17 or 100% are LMI) for housing. The total project cost is \$1,148,274, with \$148,274 in match and leverage.
1747	Vidalia, City of Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$750,000	The City of Vidalia proposes to use \$750,000 in CDBG funds to make street and drainage improvements in conjunction with city financed water and sewer improvements. The project consists of resurfacing and drainage along Bay Street between 4th and 7th Streets. This program will benefit 128 persons, of whom 106 (82%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$1,262,899, with \$512,899 in match and leverage funds.

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1679	Vienna, City of Neighborhood Revitalization	\$715,000	The City of Vienna proposes to use \$715,000 in CDBG funds for housing improvements on Gregory and W. Woodward Streets. The project will rehabilitate four housing units, reconstruct eight housing units, and acquire and clear three housing units. The project will benefit 53 persons, of whom 49 (92%) are LMI. Rehabilitation and reconstruction activities will benefit 26 persons, all of whom will be LMI. The total project cost is \$753,391, with \$38,391 in match and leverage.
1765	Ware County Youth Center	\$750,000	Ware County proposes to use \$750,000 in CDBG funds for construction of a new youth center. The 4,830 square-foot facility will be used by the Magnolia House Youth Development Center. The project will benefit 385 persons, of whom 385 (100%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$823,371, with \$73,731 in match and leverage funds.
1711	Warrenton, City of Sewer Improvements	\$750,000	The City of Warrenton proposes to use \$750,000 in CDBG funds to replace aging and failing sewer lines within two target areas. The project will benefit 123 persons, of whom 100 (81%) are LMI. The project will rehabilitate approximately 5,264 linear feet of clay sewer lines through pipe-bursting, install approximately 400 linear feet of new 8-inch sewer lines, and rehabilitate 25 manholes. The total project cost is \$832,274.20, with \$82,274.20 in match and leverage funds.
1740	Wilcox County Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$622,105	Wilcox County proposes to use \$622,105 in CDBG funds for road and drainage improvements. The project consists of paving Falcon Circle and creating 14,980 linear feet of storm drainage improvements. The project will benefit 75 persons, of whom 68 (91%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$708,105, with \$86,000 in match and leverage funds.
1678	Worth County Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$391,937	Worth County proposes to use \$391,937 in CDBG funds for street and drainage improvements in the Johnny Aultman Road neighborhood. The project will install 24-foot wide base and pavement on the dirt road, including a cul-de-sac, as well as 5-foot shoulders on both sides of the roadway, and storm drain pipes. The project will benefit 80 persons, of whom 58 (72.5%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$527,848, with \$135,911 in match and leverage.

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1719	Wrens, City of Sewer Improvements	\$585,522	The City of Wrens proposes to use \$585,522 in CDBG funds for sewer system improvements in the Southeast area of Wrens, which includes Geter and Stephens Street Extension, part of Center Street, and the Green Meadow and Pine Valley apartment complexes. The project will rehabilitate 4,151 linear feet of 8-inch sewer line, rehabilitate 1,345 linear feet of 10-inch sewer line, replace 7 manholes, rehabilitate 16 manholes, and replace 33 active services and cleanouts. The project will benefit 277 persons, of whom 269 (97%) are LMI. The total project cost is \$665,098, with \$79,576 in match and leverage.

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
